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INTRODUCTION



This report aims to assess the impact of CHORD girl's education program in Hyderabad, Telangana. The project strives to enroll, educate and mainstream 120 working/dropout girl children every year through their bridge school project in Ranga Reddy District, Telangana. The program provided a holistic and flexible learning opportunity to children and also laid emphasis on supporting children in their early adulthood stage and strived to empower the students by making up for lost education and rebuilding a learning foundation, integrating the child into mainstream education and enabling the child toward a sturdy development plan through guidance and care.

The guiding values for CHORD are following:

- Education- the only road to Freedom from Exploitation
- Every child deserves a childhood.
- All Children have a Right to Participation, Development, Dignity, Love, Care & affection.

THREE STAGE PROCESS

Chord has adopted a three stage process to reach its desired goal:

Stage I: Aashirwad Remedial School – To help the child regain his/her lost childhood and give them enough time for the children to understand the meaning of a school as the curriculum is simple and not exam-oriented. Bridge school is like an ice-breaking exercise.

Stage II: Formal School (Post mainstreaming) – Integration into formal school enhances the child's self-discipline, boosts confidence and the child is integrated into the educational mainstream.

Stage III: Vocational Training or Tertiary education (After School) – To prepare adolescents for acquiring a sustainable, dignified age-appropriate livelihood opportunity

The report consolidates the analyses of CHORD's overall achievements and long-term impacts through its interventions in the period 2022–23. In a dynamic and demanding environment, where complexities surround the process of social change, CHORD's effort, here, is to understand the extent to which changes have been made in the life of a girl child in Hyderabad.



Through synthesizing the outcomes and impacts from a diverse range of assessments, this report aims to represent CHORD's contribution towards the realization of girl child education, but also learning.

SCOPE

The impact assessment report for the CHORD project focusing on enrolling, educating, and mainstreaming urban deprived girl child laborers showcases a comprehensive scope of activities and achievements. The project's scope emphasizes on addressing the challenges faced by vulnerable children through a structured approach that includes identification, rescue, rehabilitation, and mainstreaming.

Key elements of the project's scope include:

1. Identification and Motivation: Targeting densely populated areas with child labor, conducting door-to-door surveys, and providing initial support to children and parents.

2. Bridge School Enrollment: Ensuring protection of child rights, indoctrinating children into the school environment, and providing counseling.

3. Teacher Recruitment and Training: Recruiting local community members as staff, developing training manuals, and conducting teacher training sessions.

4. Curricular and Extracurricular Activities: Implementing peer group interactions, play activities, soft skills, and computer training.

5. Liaison and Mainstreaming: Facilitating coordination between various stakeholders and mainstreaming children into formal schools based on their learning abilities.

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

The scope highlights achievements across various key performance indicators such as survey coverage, enrollment targets, identity verification, staff employment, attendance rates, academic performance, nutrition provision, healthcare, and family benefits.



The report also underscores challenges encountered including parental and employer resistance, post-COVID-19 fears, extreme poverty, and absenteeism.

Despite these challenges, the project has succeeded in improving literacy rates, enhancing learning outcomes, increasing community engagement, and sensitizing parents towards the importance of education.

Overall, the scope of the project demonstrates a holistic approach towards the rehabilitation and empowerment of urban deprived girl children, aiming to break the cycle of child labor and provide them with opportunities for a dignified and sustainable future.

Current State Assessment: Before the Program

Child Labour Prevalence in Hyderabad Slums

In Hyderabad slums, prior to the initiation of programs like those by CHORD, there was a significant prevalence of child labour, particularly among girls. Research indicates that about 15% of slums had 2-5% of children working, with some slums reporting even higher rates, exceeding 40%. This prevalence of child labour is a concerning issue that affects the education and overall development of children, especially girls who are often engaged in labor instead of attending school.

Despite the adverse working conditions and health risks associated with child labour, a significant portion of working children expressed satisfaction with their conditions, highlighting the complex dynamics that perpetuate this issue.

Efforts to address child labour prevalence in Hyderabad slums are crucial to safeguarding the rights and well-being of children. Initiatives like those undertaken by CHORD, which provide free education, skill development training, and support for children, youth, and women in gaining employment or self-employment, play a vital role in combating child labour and promoting holistic development. By focusing on education, skill-building, and empowerment programs, organisations like CHORD contribute to breaking the cycle of poverty and exploitation that perpetuates child labour in vulnerable communities.

Education and Literacy Rates in Hyderabad




Hyderabad, the capital of Telangana, faces challenges related to education and literacy rates, especially among girls. According to recent data, Telangana has the fourth-lowest literacy rate among large states in India, with a literacy rate of 72.8%. The rural literacy rate in Telangana is even lower at 53.7%, highlighting disparities between urban and rural areas.

The dropout rates in Telangana are a concern, with higher rates observed in secondary education compared to primary education. The dropout rate for boys is higher than that for girls, indicating gender disparities in educational attainment. Additionally, there is a significant gender gap in literacy, with 15.4% less females being literate than males in Telangana.

Teachers in Hyderabad have raised concerns about the extensive use of English in education, particularly in corporate schools, which can create barriers for students from government schools. This emphasis on English has been linked to higher dropout rates among government school students, impacting overall literacy rates. To address these challenges and improve literacy rates, there is a call for a balanced approach to language education that includes promoting education in the mother tongue alongside English instruction.


Efforts like the CHORD project aim to provide remedial schooling to rescue, educate, and reintegrate children into formal education systems. Such initiatives play a crucial role in addressing the low literacy rates and limited educational opportunities faced by many children in Hyderabad and beyond.



Gender Gap in Education in Hyderabad



In Hyderabad, Telangana, efforts have been made to address the gender gap in education, particularly in higher education. Recent data from the All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) 2018-19 reveals a significant shift towards gender parity. In 2012-13, there were 1.41 lakh more males than females enrolled in colleges and universities in Telangana. However, today, there are over 21,000 more females than males pursuing higher education, leading to a rise in the gender parity index from 0.79 to 1.02 over the past eight years.



Gender Parity Index

The increase in female enrollment is attributed to various factors such as scholarships, improved amenities like residential education, and a changing mindset among parents regarding the safety and security of their daughters. Additionally, measures like reserving seats for girls in prestigious institutions like Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) have contributed to reducing gender disparities.

While strides have been made towards gender equality in education, there is still work to be done to ensure equal outcomes for women in leadership positions, academic roles, pay equity, and research opportunities within higher education institutions.



Education

CHORD has been instrumental in providing increased access to education for girls through projects like the bridge school initiative. This project aims to rescue, educate, and mainstream working girl children every year, with a focus on migrant urban child labourers. By employing remedial schooling strategies, CHORD has successfully reintegrated over 16,000 children into formal education systems.

CHORD, through its bridge school project, aims to enroll, educate, and mainstream 120 working or dropout girl children annually in Ranga Reddy District, Telangana, India. The program focuses on breaking the cycle of child labour by providing innovative remedial education that leads to formal and vocational education. It offers a flexible learning environment, supports children in their early adulthood, and empowers them by rebuilding their educational foundation. The Aashirwad School for girl children, a collaboration between CHORD and Qualcomm, strives to provide primary, secondary, and higher education along with vocational training. The ultimate goal is to empower these children to lead dignified lives independently.

It aimed to provide rescued children with Stationery items (5 sets of Textbooks and Notebooks) for which the number was 600 and was truly achieved.

The program's objectives include empowering children to have their own identity, using education as a preventive measure against exploitation, providing opportunities for bridge school and formal education, assisting in holistic psychosocial development, enabling independent settlement in society, and sensitizing the community while empowering ultra-poor families. By focusing on rescue, rehabilitation, and reintegration into the formal education system, CHORD aims to restore childhoods and mainstream children into schools through transitory education.

Health and Well-being:



CHORD has been actively involved in initiatives to support various communities. One of their key efforts includes providing free education, skill development training, and employment opportunities to children, youth, and women. Additionally, the Mid-Day Meal Scheme in India plays a crucial role in improving nutrition and overall well-being. This scheme aims to combat malnutrition, hunger, and lack of education among school children by providing nutritious meals to enhance their nutritional status and encourage regular school attendance..

CHORD's initiative aimed at providing food and nutrition (Mid-day Meals) to **120 students** which amounted to a huge total of **28080 meals**. Along with it ,CHORD provided 120 care kits which included masks,sanitizers and soaps besides sanitizing the school.

The Mid-Day Meal Scheme has shown significant benefits such as providing essential nutrition to students, increasing school attendance among economically disadvantaged students, improving learning outcomes through proper nutrition, alleviating financial burdens for families, and incentivizing education by offering free meals during school hours. Moreover, the scheme promotes social equity and inclusion by providing meals to all children regardless of their socio-economic status and encourages gender equality by supporting the enrollment and retention of girls in schools. Overall, the Mid-Day Meal Programme not only addresses hunger and malnutrition but also empowers children, promotes equality, supports local economies, and fosters sustainability for a brighter future.

Empowerment:

These empowerment initiatives aimed at girls had profound effects on their confidence, self-esteem, and overall life skills development. By focusing on empowering students who had experienced gaps in their education, CHORD helped them regain lost ground and establish a strong foundation for future growth. Providing opportunities for these students to enhance their knowledge, skills, and abilities boosted their self-confidence and belief in their capabilities. Encouraging them to take on challenges, learn new things and develop essential life skills can equip them with the tools needed to navigate various aspects of life successfully.

Through mentorship, education, and support, it empowered girls to overcome obstacles, pursue their goals, and contribute meaningfully to society. Ultimately, empowerment initiatives not only benefit the individual but also have a ripple effect on communities and societies as a whole.



Community:

Sensitizing parents and community members about the significance of girls' education is crucial for fostering gender equality and socioeconomic development. According to UNESCO, globally over 130 million girls are out of school, highlighting the urgent need for awareness campaigns. Data shows that educating girls not only benefits them individually but also has a ripple effect on society, leading to lower child mortality rates, improved economic growth, and enhanced community well-being.

Initiatives such as workshops, seminars, and outreach programs can effectively convey the message about the transformative power of education for girls.

This initiative by CHORD helped sensitize 90% of parents and community members exposing them to the importance of school education.

Empowering ultra-poor families through awareness and support involves targeted interventions to uplift marginalized communities. By providing access to education, healthcare, vocational training and financial assistance, these families can break the cycle of poverty.

Child Labour Prevalence:

Child labour prevalence has seen a reduction due to a focus on education and rehabilitation efforts. Initiatives like providing free education, skill development training and supporting children have contributed to this positive change.

Extended and improved schooling for children is highlighted as the most effective way to eliminate child labour, as regular school attendance can prevent bonded labour and exploitation of children in hazardous industries

DEPENDENCIES





CHORD relies on donor support and fundraising efforts to sustain its operations. It receives funding through monetary donations and gifts-in-kind for its various projects and initiatives.

Risks and challenges



Challenges

Employers' and parents' resistance:

Run awareness efforts that highlight the long-term advantages of education in order to overcome reluctance. To foster trust, work with neighbourhood companies and maintain direct lines of communication with employers and parents.

Fears Following COVID-19:

Through counselling, open communication, and cooperation with health authorities, allay post-Covid-19 anxieties. To allay parents' worries, provide correct information regarding safety precautions and immunisation schedules.

Severe Poverty Situations:

Partnering with NGOs and neighbourhood businesses to provide financial aid, school supplies, and feeding programmes can help combat dropouts caused by extreme poverty. Inform parents about scholarships and support programmes and give them vocational training.

Children Who Drop Out Are Reluctant:

Use focused intervention programmes and individualized counseling sessions to overcome the resistance of dropout children. Use flexible learning strategies, such as vocational training or part-time education, and include the community leaders to emphasize the long-term benefits of education.

Risks

With limited funding, variable resource availability, and a long-term community support requirement, CHORD India must ensure programme sustainability. Long-term viability depends on establishing alliances, diversifying funding sources, and looking into income-generating projects.



Resolving learning gaps and taking into account a range of learning styles are essential to preserving the standard of education. Ensuring high educational standards through curriculum adaptation and the implementation of effective remedial education contributes to meaningful learning experiences for all pupils.

Regular community meetings, open communication, and active participation in decision-making are just a few of the continuous efforts needed to sustain community engagement. Getting long-term support for the programme requires making sure the community is aware of its goals. Enough support is essential in healthcare, particularly in the aftermath of a pandemic. Making preventative measures a priority, visiting the doctor frequently, and forming alliances with healthcare providers all contribute to a safe and healthy program environment.

CHORD India faces significant risks and challenges in administering its programs, including overcoming resistance from parents and employers, addressing post-Covid-19 fears, tackling extreme poverty conditions, managing absenteeism, ensuring program sustainability, maintaining educational quality, sustaining community engagement, and providing essential healthcare support. These challenges require ongoing efforts and strategic planning to mitigate their impact on the organization's mission and goals.

EFFORTS AND RESOURCES



As we previously saw how the impact that CHORD has created has grown substantially over the years, with it comes the continual pressure to come up with the demand that this impact requires. CHORD thus requires dynamic improvement in these 3 areas:

HUMAN RESOURCES

Tidentification, Motivation, and Counseling: Ensuring that no child is left behind through a systematic identification of children in need. encouraging awareness efforts to help parents and kids understand the importance of education.

Recruitment, Preparation, and Activities for Teachers: rigorous hiring procedures to choose community members who are qualified and committed teachers. Teachers should participate in ongoing professional development programmes to improve their pedagogical abilities and adjust to changing teaching approaches.Organising and carrying out extracurricular and curricular activities to offer a comprehensive educational experience.

Creating Connections: establishing trusting relationships with government agencies to help manage regulations and promote cooperation. working with companies to provide the kids with opportunities for future employment and vocational training. forming connections with funders to obtain funding for long-term programme expansion.

Mainstreaming: Individualized assessment of children's learning abilities to identify suitable mainstream schools. Providing support during the transition to ensure a smooth integration into the formal education system.

FINDINGS AND ANALYSIS



The CHORD Project, originating in Hyderabad's most vulnerable slums with severe gender disparities, has expanded its scope to neighboring areas. Its overarching goal is to extend its interventions to all regions with gender inequities, aiming to enhance service delivery across the board.

Since its establishment, the CHORD Project has positively impacted 2160 girl children over nine years, focusing on education and empowerment. Notably, it has substantially increased school attendance rates from 65% to 90% in the past seven years.

Survey and Mobilization

Overview:



Out of the planned 15 slum clusters, the campaign achieved coverage in 10 during June and July 2022. Field workers spearheaded the initiative, aiming to grasp the nuances of urban poverty and its impact on these marginalized communities.

Work Done:

Field workers diligently conducted surveys and mobilization efforts in the designated slum clusters. Through interviews, questionnaires, and community engagement activities, they gathered crucial data on residents' needs, challenges, and aspirations.

Result:

The campaign yielded partial coverage, addressing a portion of the targeted slum clusters. Data collected by field workers serves as a pivotal resource for understanding the complexities of urban poverty and devising tailored interventions. Despite partial success, the initiative laid the groundwork for future interventions, emphasizing the importance of data-driven approaches in addressing the multifaceted issues faced by slum dwellers. Moving forward, leveraging this data will be critical in expanding coverage and designing more impactful strategies to uplift marginalized urban communities.

Door-to-Door Campaign

Overview:

A total of 200 households were surveyed out of the intended 230, meeting the deadline of July 31, 2022.

Work Done:

Field workers diligently conducted door-to-door surveys within urban slums, aiming to gather comprehensive data on residents' living conditions, needs, and challenges.

Result:

The campaign nearly reached its target, successfully surveying a significant portion of the intended households. The data collected serves as a valuable resource for understanding the dynamics of urban poverty and informing future interventions aimed at improving living standards in slum areas.

Enrollment of Children in Bridge School

Overview:

By August 31, 2022, the initiative successfully enrolled 120 children for the academic year 2022-23, meeting its target on time.

Work Done:

Field workers diligently identified and enrolled children into the bridge school program, ensuring access to education for marginalized youths. This involved extensive outreach efforts and collaboration with communities to overcome barriers to enrollment.

Result:

The accomplishment of the enrollment target signifies a significant stride in providing educational opportunities for underserved children. By securing placements in the bridge school program, these children are granted access to foundational education, fostering their personal development and breaking the cycle of poverty. Classification of Children based on their learning ability

By August 31, 2022, 127 children were successfully classified based on age and learning ability, surpassing the set target.

Vetting: Evaluating and establishing the identity of children through Aadhar card

Employment Generation

By July 31, 2022, the initiative successfully provided full-time employment to 11 local community members, comprising 7 teaching and 4 nonteaching staff, all of whom are on regular rolls.

Teacher Training

School Attendance

Families are increasingly motivated to ensure their children attend school regularly, encouraged by the prospect of their children receiving essential nutrition. Consequently, there has been a significant decrease in the number of students dropping out of school. This proactive approach has led to a remarkable increase in attendance rates, with figures surpassing 87 percent in various regions. By addressing the basic need for nutritious food, schools have succeeded in fostering an environment conducive to learning, wherein students feel valued and supported in their educational journey. Furthermore, this initiative not only enhances academic performance but also nurtures holistic development. By ensuring that students have access to nutritious meals, schools contribute to their overall well-being, enabling them to focus more effectively on their studies.



Additionally, this approach plays a crucial role in promoting equity within the education system by addressing socio-economic disparities that often hinder educational attainment. It underscores the importance of providing essential support to all students, regardless of their background, to ensure equal opportunities for success and growth in their academic endeavors.

In conclusion, despite the challenges of urban poverty and child labour, CHORD's girl's education programme in Hyderabad has emerged as a ray of hope. The project has restored lost childhoods and reintegrated girls into mainstream education, promoting self-discipline and confidence, all through a rigorous three-stage process. The scope, which includes liaison, teacher training, enrollment, and identification, demonstrates an all-encompassing strategy. Notwithstanding obstacles, the project has greatly raised learning results and literacy rates, highlighting the critical role that education plays in ending the cycle of child labour. A better, more independent future is promised by CHORD's steadfast dedication to upholding every girl child's right to an education.
